Hand sanitizer stock, like that of kettlebells and toilet paper, has been pretty inconsistent since the pandemic hit. As stores quickly ran out of Purell, well-known luxury brands, like Aesop became the fallback for anyone who could afford the cost. Now, even the high-end fancy hand sanitizers are gone. These days, if you want hand sanitizer, you'll likely have to get it from a boutique skincare retailer right as they launch, a distillery—because hand sanitizer is mostly alcohol—that's shifted its production, or as a "free gift" for purchasing other items.

It's worth noting that hand sanitizer is not your only line of defense against the spread of the coronavirus. Much more important are socially distancing, wearing a mask outside, not touching your face, and washing your hands—often—for at least 20 seconds.
